



Excellence in Construction Awards Rules & Guidelines

Associated Builders and Contractors invites your company to enter its best projects in the 2024 ABC CF Excellence in Construction Awards Competition and celebrate the industry's finest!

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Program Overview

The purpose of the ABC Excellence in Construction Awards program is to recognize the outstanding projects built by ABC CF members. Such recognition will bring about a greater industry awareness of the quality and craftsmanship of work produced by merit shop contractors and their team.

All award winners will be recognized at the Excellence in Construction Awards banquet on Saturday, October 26, 2024 at the Hilton Orlando on Destination Parkway and through many publication avenues through the chapter.

Eligibility

- Company must be an ABC CF **General Contractor** or **Subcontractor** member
 - **Joint ventures** are eligible if the company entering is a Central FL Chapter member
 - Subcontractors may enter a project even if the GC is not a current ABC CF member
 - Subcontractors may enter a project even if the GC did not enter the project
 - There is no limit to the number of projects a company may enter
- The project entered should be completed (e.g., Certificate of Occupancy issued) by **April 30, 2024**. **There is some flexibility depending on project and situation, please ask ABC staff to clarify*
- Projects that won ABC awards in previous years are **not** eligible except in the case of substantial renovation or additions.
- Projects are not limited to Central Florida and can be submitted from anywhere members do work around the country.
- WDI, WDW, or Universal – These projects require additional approval process, please clarify with an ABC staff member.
- Projects with a safety-related fatality within the current program year is not eligible for an EIC Award. No project that involves prime, multi-prime or sub-trade contractors with a safety-related fatality is eligible to be considered for an award.

Overview of Awards

- **Eagle Award** – Only one project from each category and contract amount may be awarded the first place Eagle Award. Project must earn 80% or more of the eligible points and score highest in their category. Eagle Award winners will receive a complimentary Soaring Eagle trophy, which will be presented on stage at the awards banquet and will be listed in the annual EIC Awards magazine.
- **Award of Merit** – Projects must earn a minimum of 70% of the eligible points for an Award of Merit. Winners are listed in the annual EIC Awards magazine and will receive a complimentary plaque.
- **Honorable Mention** - If a project does not earn the minimum points required for an Award of Merit, the project will receive Honorable Mention.

Special Awards

- **BEAM Club Member of the Year** - The BEAM Club was established in 1966 by the National Board of Directors as an exclusive club to recognize members that champion membership across the country. This award celebrates one member for recruiting the most new members throughout the year.
- **Free Enterprise Awards** – One General Contractor company and one Subcontractor company will be presented this award for utilizing the largest number of ABC CF members (*subcontractors, suppliers, and associate members*) working directly on any one project that is entered in this year's awards competition. Free Enterprise Award winners do not have to be Eagle Award winners.
- **Model Members of the Year Awards** – One contractor level winner as well as one associate or supplier level member company will be presented this award for maximizing their ABC membership to the fullest by making new business relationships, enriching networking experiences, and gaining a wealth of industry knowledge. This award is determined based on company attendance at events, supporting programs, joining a committee, volunteering at events, contributing to industry publications, participating in safety, referring members, and getting company trained.
- **Subcontractor Project of the Year Award** – Subcontractor projects that win an Eagle may be nominated for the top Subcontractor Award. Up to five projects may be nominated and asked to give a presentation of their project at the ABC office for final judging. The nominees are judged on complexity and challenge level, the uniqueness and innovation of construction, and the level of exceptional quality.
- **Project of the Year Award** – General contractor projects that win an Eagle may be nominated for the Project of the Year Award. Up to five projects may be nominated and asked to give a second on-site presentation and tour of their project. The winning project exemplifies the contributions of quality construction to Central Florida. The nominees are judged on complexity and challenge level, the uniqueness and innovation of construction, the level of exceptional quality, and the effect on the Central Florida community.
- **Young Professional of the Year** – One young professional within the Central Florida community to be honored for their above and beyond efforts and surpassing industry standards. This can be any member of your company that you nominate, a member of the students chapters, or young professionals group at the chapter.
- **Other Special Awards** – Special awards may be given at the discretion of the judges and EIC Awards Committee.

May	STEP Applications Due May 15	STEP participation is not required but by completing the National STEP (<i>Safety Training Evaluation Process</i>) application and listing Central Florida Chapter ABC as a primary or additional chapter, you will earn an additional 4 points . Safety Bonus points will count towards every project entry score if STEP application is completed by May 15, 2024 . <i>*Safety is required to be eligible for special awards</i>
June	EIC Judging: On-site Presentations or Presentations at ABC Office June 14 June 19 June 21 June 25	Enter online: abc.org/en-us/safety/step.aspx . After all entries are evaluated for location and category type, ABC will create a judging schedule based on the availability of each lead presenter, project site, and judges/volunteers. The schedule is created based on the Project Judging Information supplied on the Entry Form, so verify with all parties (<i>project site, owner, presenter, etc.</i>) prior to submitting and then keep ABC up to date if there are changes in the availability or schedule.

	June 27	<p>Flexibility increases the opportunity for a successful presentation and score.</p> <p>ABC will assign a date, start, and end time to each project for judging and notify each contractor. Each contractor is responsible to confirm meeting date and time assigned/relay to others involved.</p> <p>Note: When a project needs to be rescheduled for judging, it can affect up to 10-12 people involved in the judging team’s schedule. So, please communicate and verify information – get on everyone’s calendars.</p>

Subcontractor/Specialty Work: Subcontractors, select **ONE** category

- Concrete
- Electrical

- Furnishings/Interior Specialties
- Glass & Glazing – Doors/Windows
- HVAC
- Interior Finishes – Drywall, metal support assemblies, plaster, tile, terrazzo, ceilings, walls, floors, acoustical, paints, coatings (select one): _____
- Landscape/Hardscape
- Masonry, Precast or Stone
- Plumbing
- Site Work
- Structural & Miscellaneous Metals
- Thermal & Moisture Protection – Roofing
- Wood & Millwork
- Other Specialty Construction - Construction not specifically referred to in the above categories (theming, lightning protection, pools, building automation, special purpose rooms, etc.):

General Contractor/Building Type: General Contractors, select **ONE** category

- Commercial – Office buildings, banks, retail, hotels, mixed use
- Community Service – Philanthropic projects, regardless of type, that enhance the community, using substantial (35%=) resources donated by the contractor. Entries should include information detailing the donated resources.
- Entertainment Facilities – Theme parks, zoos, water parks, stadiums, sports arenas, etc.
- Historical Renovation – Restoration of historical buildings
- Health Care – Hospitals, nursing homes, assisted living, and other licensed medical facilities
- Industrial – Manufacturing plants and facilities, refineries, and similar types of construction
- Infrastructure: Heavy – Streets, highways, dams and bridges
- Infrastructure: Light – Parks and community trails
- Institutional – Projects owned by schools, churches and local governments except for health care facilities
- Interiors – Tenant build-out
- Pre-engineered Buildings
- Public Works/Environmental - Water treatment plants, sewage treatment plants
- Residential/Multifamily – Residential, including independent living retirement communities, single family projects, multifamily, and condominiums
- Other Construction – Construction not specifically referred to in the above categories:

Scope

A description (*no more than a page*) of the scope for this project with the following information:

- Type of Construction
- Size of Project
- Contract Value
- Duration of Project
- Percentage of Labor (*self-performed*)
- Describe the opportunities you provide to the construction community to participate based on merit

Narrative

Provide a written narrative indicating why this project deserves to win an award and what makes it a more specialized project. The focus of the narrative should be the construction (*erection, installation, modification, grade footprint, etc.*) of the project. Photos, images, and progression photos are suggested. Be sure to include the following information:

- Innovative Programs (*Quality Control, Scheduling, etc.*)
- Value Analysis and Engineering Processes
- Special Obstacles Overcame
- Difficulties or Extenuating Circumstances Encountered
- Innovative Programs or Methods related to Productivity
